

Letter from Pastor P+ April 14, 2020

Easter came without bright spring dresses, lilies and flowers filling the sanctuary, without Easter Brunches at church or Egg hunts in the garden. But Easter still came, because Christ is still risen!

I remind people every year that Easter lasts 50 days! (yep all the way to May 31 this year) and every Sunday is a 'Little Easter' as we commemorate Jesus' life death and resurrection in Holy Communion.

But you can be comforted to know that it was different for all of us – we all felt a little let down that Easter moment we cherish could not happen. We maintain this virtual community at Holy Cross these days partly to honor God and our faith, but also to comfort us each in our mourning. Because there is real grief in the massive changes we have lived through since Mid March 2020. We miss the touch of each others' hands in sharing the Peace. We miss hearing the voices sing the favorite hymns, and we miss the corporate generosity in passing the offering plate. I miss seeing you all as I preach my sermons – I truly use your reactions, your connection to make the sermon work. It is a different thing to preach to a camera.

But, we have made it through Holy Week and Easter, and now let's do a new thing – let's try to connect in new ways in order to share the weight of this experience.
