Sermon for November 15 - It isn't about money. We're talking today about Matthew 25 beginning with verse 14 - it's the parable of the talents. A talent is a unit of money. And, my friends, I would appreciate it if you would trust me that these verses near the end of Matthew's Gospel are not about money. A talent is a ridiculously large amount of money. Equal to 16 years of wages, in those days, which in modern terms equates to at least \$1 million dollars. So, the master in the parable Jesus tells today in Matthew 25 entrusts 3 of his slaves, yep they are slaves, not just salaried employees, part of the times in which Jesus lived that makes us uncomfortable. The master entrusts 3 of his slaves with a total of 8 million dollars while he goes on a journey. So, it's a cartoonlike amount of money, a fantastical amount of money. And so, It isn't about money. So, my friends, every 3 years when I come upon a lesson from the lectionary, I think to myself, why is this passage coming up in the lectionary now, why is it important for me and for the dear souls who get the joy of listening to e preach? What are we supposed to learn, what are we to take away. Well, one thing, its not about money. Matthew's gospel has a theme, my friends, and this passage is congruent with that theme. The Theme is, "God's son came to earth to save us from our sins." We need to be saved my friends, we are sinful people. Even you. We say unkind things, we think mean thoughts, and I think worst of all, we have hardened our hearts against the plight of those who are struggling, starving, and afflicted. How can this be? Our Lord is a lord of compassion, and we are God's servants, given life as a gift. How is it we find compassion outside our reach? There's a comic drawing that makes me smile, of two people sitting and talking. One of them is Jesus. The other person says, "How can you sit by and watch while people starve and horrific things happen?" And Jesus says to the person, :I was just going to ask you the same thing." We are the slaves in the story my friends. And our master has gone on a journey and left us in charge. Do we use the resources the master gives us for good or do we not? As I say, it's not about money. There are key things to notice in the scripture, the opening - "For the kingdom of heaven is like a man traveling to a far country, who called his own servants and delivered his goods to them. You and I are the Christians who live in the time after Jesus walked the earth. He has surely gone to a far country. We are surely his own servants, and we are in receipt of the man's goods. The master's goods. Not ours. We are merely caretakers of this earth, our island home. It would be good if we didn't mess up the place too much. And the servants are not called to give an account for a long time. A long time. It's been more than 2000 years since Jesus left us behind, and the waiting for Christians can feel so long that we almost begin to doubt we'll ever have to give an accounting. I don't know when Jesus is coming back, and neither do you, but I do know that when we die, we will be in that presence of God and for you and for me that will be the end of the world. I am expecting a conversation about this. What did we do with what we were entrusted? I think about that. And then there's the third slave, who is asked for an accounting and says, "I knew you to be a hard man." Well, that's not a good start. This is not an accounting he is giving but an excuse. A fine quote I know is "It is the genius of wicked men to lay the blame of their miscarriages upon others, oftentimes upon God himself." Remember what I told you the point of matthew's gospel is? To show that Jesus came to save us from our sins. Well, my friends, the parable of the talents is story, a fiction, used by Jesus to help his listeners then, and now to realize that the master is going away. For a long time. And we've got the ball. Will we make the plays that are needed to advance the game? A little basketball visual. Or will we make excuses and blame the God who entrusts us with an unbelievably large gift - the whole of the planet, and all the people. For such a time as this we were placed upon the earth, my friends. Our neighbors and friends are dying from a pandemic. We can protect them, if we care. Our friends and neighbors are toiling at jobs that do not feed their family or allow them to go to the doctor. We can protect them if we care. Our fellow human beings are struggling with great loss due to wildfire, or civil war, throughout the world. We can assist them, if we care. Expecting God to bring the hail mary pass to every catastrophe or sad moment in the world is the act of the third servant. We have been entrusted with the talent, by the master who believes in us. Let's get into the game. Amen. - Pastor Patricia Hughes
