The Creator of the stars bless your Advent waiting, the long-expected Savior fill you with love, the unexpected Spirit guide your journey, + now and forever.

A little Joy – this isn't a sermon (our Advent sermons are coming through the Stronger Together churches in NE Salem – I was on the week 2 video, for Peace) but something else. Maybe it's a blog, maybe its just some thoughts. I prepared for our weekly bible study this week at Holy Cross which we call "What is God Saying Today?". And the texts were all about Joy. And I recorded a kids' sermon about Joy, and it seems I still have somethings left to say. Joy is hard this year. But it is not absent. You just have to look a little harder for it.

My sister gave me 3 Goldfinch ornaments this year for my tree. The Goldfinch finally came to visit my feeder this spring when I learned to put out thistle just for them. And then the wildfires in our area drove them away. They came back about a month ago, but just for a few days. I look for them when I wash the dishes at my kitchen sink, which looks out on my feeders. I pray they are safe, and that I just don't know enough about goldfinch behavior to understand why they are so scarce right now.

I've been thinking about Zephaniah, Old testament prophet, who lived in a time when the people of Israel were trying to claw their way back from a time of great fear, and a bunch of bad decisions. And he talked about Joy. From the Message - Your God is present among you, a strong Warrior there to save you. Happy to have you back, he'll calm you with his love and delight you with his songs.

Does this speak to us today? <u>Happy to have you back</u> – in many ways I think folks are returning to God, listening to that voice, and finding peace in small moments.

<u>He'll calm you with his love</u>—well, calm is important right now, when we are all running to our thermometers when we have a small cough or a tickle in our throats. Just breathe, God is offering calm to you now – taking walks down streets and paths where few people are so we don't have to worry about perfect mask etiquette – God is there, calming, holding our hand.

<u>Delight you with his songs</u> – I really miss congregational singing. My favorite church memories of my youth are of my father and I sitting together, sharing a hymnal – he would take the bass line, and I would take the alto, and we would enjoy offering our 'flavoring' to the sounds of others singing all around our pew. Can you find God's song in new ways right now? One of my walks takes me alongside Silver Creek, and its been very full lately – the sound of the water cascading over rocks is so sweet. God's song might be in the sound of the wind blowing through the trees near my house. Can you find God's song in nature, in the steady breathing of a small child or a small corgi in your house?

Joy for me, will always be connected to the singing of "Joy to the World" as the congregation leaves church on Christmas Eve, as the candles are blown out following singing "Silent Night" and the whole church emerges into the world of the Incarnation- the birth. But, this year we will be unable to gather for that moment indoors with 100 of our closest friends. I am thankful for scientists and government officials who have advised us to avoid large gatherings in order to slow the spread of Covid-19.

Instead, I will cling to Zephaniah 3:17's opening words – Your God is Present among you, a strong Warrior there to save you. I am praying for you all these days, that you stay safe, and do not contract this illness that will threaten your lives. Our lives are different now, but Joy remains – in new ways, in quieter ways, in more personal ways. Praying for your Joy this week, and always – Pastor Patricia Hughes
