We did it - and Love is the reason! - Mailing out Tuesday, June 15, 2021

Sunday, June 13th turned out to be rainy, and so we met in the sanctuary (masked and socially distant) – with the 43 voting members who were in attendance. Worship had music (yes, the choir, though masked) sang, and introduced us to a wonderful new sung liturgy. There was communion (yes, individual cups in our seats), and there was coffee in the narthex (joyfully enjoyed!).

Then we voted on two proposals – first to sell the Easter House (a property adjacent to Holy Cross where we had a preschool for many years, that we have recently rented as a 'first step' for houseless families through Family Promise). Family Promise offered to buy that property as well as the lot behind it in a plan to continue to offer housing in the future. They offered to buy the property as is, with the list of repairs needed topping \$50,000 to make the house usable. Their offer of \$200,000 was accepted by the congregation unanimously in our vote. It seems certain that our corner of Sunnyview and Lansing is headed for more opportunities to assist folks out of poverty.

Then we voted on a proposal to adopt a welcoming statement (full statement on the back of this sheet), which would result in Holy Cross becoming a "Reconciling in Christ" Community – a safe place – for those who have felt unwelcome – the LGBTQ community as well as people from all races. This, too, passed unanimously.

To say that these are joyful, happy steps is an understatement. Holy Cross has reason to celebrate these votes as they reflect our commitment to care for

others in the name of Jesus Christ. When you see Bryan Struve, and members of your church council (last year's and this year's) tell them you are proud of them and their work. I certainly am. – Pastor Patricia+

Mustard and growth - I brought this photo with me today to illustrate my sermon. It's mustard plants, growing in the vineyards of northern California. In today's gospel from Mark 4, Jesus tells a parable about a mustard seed. It's one of the first stories from the bible that I learned and remembered, probably because I was given a necklace with a little clear heart that held a single tiny mustard seed. "if you have the faith of a mustard seed - just a little tiny bit - it's enough to change the world" Change the world. I wonder now what went through my 5 year old head when I was told my faith in God's love could change the world. I can tell you now, that I believe it. I, like you, have lived through much change in my lifetime. My first credit card was in my husband's name because they didn't issue them to women back then. I remember when my 6 foot 5 father was the tallest person on the basketball team. I remember the first time my class included a black child. Times change, the world moves forward, and sometimes we get to be part of an action that will change the world, or at least a part of it. At seminary in Berkeley, 18 years ago, I was assigned to one of the Lutheran churches in Napa California, just down the road from that picture of a vineyard full of mustard plants. Teaching parish they call it, and I provided 10 hours or more of free labor to the good people there, under the supervision of Pastor David Hamilton. He taught me how to make mistakes and keep going, how to write prayers for worship, and how to sing Holden Evening Prayer acapella. There was another Lutheran church in Napa at that time, and Pastor Carl Pihl served there. The two churches were both focused on service, and ministry to their neighbors. In that part of the world there are a lot of wealthy people, and a lot of people just getting by, or maybe not quite getting by. While I was there, the two churches held joint worship together often, and sketched a plan for continuing their connection in the months ahead. I was able to grow there in that good place, and learn a lot about caring for others. I also began to learn a bit about wine, and many Sundays after worship I would drive by a different winery to learn about wine and a bit of the history. Mustard plants under the vines were a surprise to me. They start to be visible in January and last through March, with a lush yellow carpet beneath the vines through the winter. I asked about them at a winery and was told they secrete a compound that enriches the soil, by repelling nematodes that can harm the vines. Fascinating, I thought, a symbiosis for growth. I heard legends about the mustard, which have been in that part of northern California for hundreds of years - that they were planted by the catholic priests who were planting missions there. One story says that one particular friar planted them so he could remember the path to the remote outposts he visited to bring Holy Communion - he followed the mustard path to check on remote homesteads, and offer baptism and attend to the needs of his far flung people. I had grandchildren at my house the last 10 days, it was a joy to be with them. They enjoyed my gardens, but it seemed to come up a lot that they would ask about a plant - is that a weed? And I would always say, a weed is just a plant that grows where you don't want it to grow. The weeds I pull out of my gardens every week grow beautifully and happily all along the trails we hiked in the gorge and at Silver Falls. The gospel from Mark today contains a moment when Jesus teaches his disciples using the natural world as imagery. "The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, ²⁷and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how" Jesus also said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? 31It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; ³²yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade." The people of Holy Cross, in this corner of Salem, have options to grow in front of them today - to plant seed and gather in the harvest another day - through our vote on Reconciling in Christ status - welcoming folks who have felt unwelcome in the past - and also through conversations with Christ the Good Shepherd church to find ways to collaborate and join in ministry going forward. The mustard plants in Napa Valley are a lovely addition to the beauty of their corner of the world, but are so much more - they are in fact a way to nurture the growth of others, through their own lives. I am thankful to be here today with you, as we enrich the landscape through acts and choices of purpose. Amen.
