Week 2 APP – Last Sunday it was sunny and hot, (and even more of that to come this week!) yet our Sanctuary was cold and dark. We took the week off to grieve our loss of Pastor Patricia as she left her call as Pastor of Holy Cross to enjoy a well-earned retirement. She will be missed.

Now that you have had a week off, it is time to get back at it. As I said in my last message, "Our time of transition starts now." We begin by having as our guest pastor, Reverend Rebecca Swee for the next two Sundays, August 15 and August 22. On August 29th we will have Reverend Tom Hiller on site to deliver a sermon and lead us in communion.

All these services are planned to be held indoors in our Sanctuary as we begin to return to "normal" following a year and a half of changes due to the pandemic. One of the first thoughts your church council had as we start this transition period is to bring continuity to our church life and renew the relationships that made us into one Holy Cross family. A first step is to meet at church weekly, in the Sanctuary, for some type of worship service as circumstances allow.

This may be a Service of the Word and Sacrament if we have a pastor scheduled to be with us or a Service of the Word if we do not. Music and singing will depend on the availability of a pianist and choir and the current conditions or protocols society places upon us. We may meet and have a guest speaker or conduct verse by verse bible study of the weekly readings or hold a prayer service. All options are on the table during this transition phase and if the last eighteen months have shown, the ability to be flexible and adapt to the changing conditions is key.

It takes many people to plan and produce a church service. You may see the Pastor preach, the Worship Assistant speak, and the musicians perform on any given Sunday but there is also the altar to care for, ushers and greeters to welcome you, coffee and treats to prepare and many other tasks that are needed. What can you do to help? How can you serve? What is God calling you to do?

These are but the beginning as we form our Transition Team to assess the vitality, viability, vibrancy and vision of Holy Cross and our mission here on the corner of Lansing and Sunnyview. Please join me in taking our first step this **Sunday, August 15**th at 10:00 AM in the Sanctuary as we welcome Reverend Rebecca Swee for a Service of the Word and Sacrament.
