From your Council President - June 7, 2022

Dear members of Holy Cross and friends in Christ:

Thank you for your continued support in spreading the Love of Christ through our congregation and community. I assure you that both the Council and Transition Team are as anxious to find a new pastor as you are. Two fundamental tasks need to be completed for this to happen.

First, we must complete the Ministry Site Profile. This document describes who we are as a congregation and sets our ministry expectations for the pastor we want to call. Once completed it must be approved by you, the congregation. Once approved it will be recorded in the synod office and can be made available to pastors who are looking for a call. Your transition team is well on the way to completing the task and as the team leader, Karen Halvorson, explained in last week's newsletter, they hope to bring it to you by the end of June.

The second task that must be completed before we can call a pastor is to decide just where we are as a congregation and what direction we wish to proceed. We have some big decisions to make. The Transition Team and the Council have listened to you and written some group agreements that I hope you can support. To be in group agreement does not mean that you personally agree with everything. It does mean that you can accept the group statements and support them so that we may move forward. The proposed group agreements are:

- While we are currently solvent, we do not have the financial means to support a full-time pastor long term.
- We own a beautiful but aging building that is costly to operate and maintain.
- · Our congregation is changing.

We realize that it is important for many of you to continue worshiping in this space and we hope to be able to honor that in the call process. One way to do so is to partner with another congregation in the area and put out a joint call for a two-point parish pastor. In this scenario both congregations maintain their own integrity and worship space. The pastor would serve both congregations, holding two services each Sunday, one at each site. Those of you from the Midwest may have experienced this option as I have.

We have just begun to explore this option and another congregation has expressed an interest in exploring it together. As we explore, we will keep you informed of any progress. To seriously pursue this option would take both Council and Congregational input and approval. If you have thoughts or

questions about either this option or the process, please contact a transition team or council member.
