Dear Members and Friends of Holy Cross Lutheran Church,

We have survived the pandemic! We are again worshiping together every Sunday at 10 AM in our sanctuary. If you have not been able to attend, we miss you and hope that you have been able to stay in tune with all that is happening at Holy Cross by reading the weekly email Blast and/or viewing our worship services on our web site, holycrosslutheransalem.org. All are welcome and everyone is invited to worship with us on Sunday mornings.

The Holy Cross that you may have grown up with and love must make some major changes to survive in this post-pandemic world. We can choose to ignore our situation and the way the world around us is changing and eventually face Holy Closure, or we can choose to embrace what Christ has taught us, to work together with clear eyed risky optimism to face new ways to spread the love of Christ to each other and beyond. Your leadership has chosen the latter, but the future of Holy Cross is in your hands. We are asking you to support us by staying informed and taking an active part in the ongoing discussions that are determining the future of our church. Here are a few things to share with you.

- **A.** Your transition team developed three statements of agreement that will help define how we look at our future church. They were approved by the congregation on July 10th.
 - 1. Our congregation is changing.
 - 2. We own a beautiful but aging building that is costly to operate and maintain.
- 3. While we are currently solvent, we do not have the financial resources to hire a full-time pastor long term.
- **B.** We are excited to look forward in finding a new ½ time pastor. The synod requires us to prepare a Ministry Site Profile that they can use to advertise the pastoral opening to new candidates. We have completed this process under the transition team leadership of Karen Halverson. The congregation adopted the document on July 10 and Bryan Struve, Interim Coordinator, has submitted the document to the synod. Hurray!!! Synod will soon post our call, however, chances of a pastor wanting to consider a ½ time call are slim.
- **C.** We are using our "Better Together" connections with Christ the Good Shepherd, who are in similar position, hoping to be able to make two half time calls into a full time calling. The Synod has provided a guideline for Holy Cross and Christ the Good Shepherd to work together. The first step is to get to know each other better. On July 31 we worshiped together at Christ the Good Shepherd and met after the service to talk with our neighbors

in faith. On **August 21** we will worship and meet again, this time **at Holy Cross**, and a third time on **September 11** at Christ the Good Shepherd. We strongly encourage you to take part in these opportunities to help us get to know our Lutheran neighbors and define the direction and future of both of our churches.

D. We are starting to explore new ways to use our building as an income source.

Holy Cross is changing. We can choose to direct that change or just let it change without our input. We may be fewer in number, but we are strong in spirit and believe that there are great opportunities to continue sharing Christ's love together. We encourage you to take an active role in determining our future by;

- ...asking questions about and discussing the events with your leaders and others.
- ...completing and returning the included member contact info update to Holy Cross;

receive our prayer.

You call us to delight in the sabbath. Renew our bodies, minds, and spirits in this worshiping assembly. Give rest to all who lead our congregation in worship, study, and service (congregational leaders may be named). Merciful God,

receive our prayer.

Here other intercessions may be offered.
