My name is Bob Brown. <u>Cars for Success</u> provides used cars in good condition for low -income folks who are employed and would benefit from car for travel to work, to attend to the needs of their children, medical appointments, and such.

To get right to the point, the <u>Cars for Success</u> committee needs more cars, and year end is a very good time to donate a car to a non-profit like **Cars for Success**.

To donate a car to us, we need the car, keys, and the title signed by the donor. We then fill out two bills of sale, give one to you and keep one for our records. This process takes less than 10 minutes.

We make sure the donor is not known to the people who receive the car. At the time we donate the car to an eligible family, we help them fill out new title paperwork for Oregon DMV, thus making the car totally owned by the receiver. We then submit this form to DMV.

If the car you want to donate is not running, we can come and pick it up. We have a trailer we can load it onto.

Once we have the car, it will be evaluated at a car shop to see if it is safe and ready for donation. Once it is evaluated, we decide what is best with that car.

Cars donated to us go to one of three places:

After any needed repairs, donated to an eligible family,

Or sold by <u>Cars for Success</u> to support the repair of other cars. (This might be a Volvo or Toyota 4Runner.)

Or if too expensive to repair, sold at an insurance auction.
