Mano a Mano Family Center is blessed to be in partnership with Holy Cross Lutheran Church for the implementation of our Casa Infantil (Children's Place) program. This is Mano a Mano's early childhood program to help foster positive interactions between children and parenting adults, and to help prepare children for a positive transition to Kindergarten. Holy Cross Lutheran Church hosts two major components of Mano a Mano's Casa Infantil Program. 1) Free play time on Fridays; 2) Reggio Emilia class groups Tuesday,

Wednesday and Thursdays. The Reggio Emilia educational approach teaches that children are capable of constructing their own learning, and to develop an understanding of themselves and their place in the world through their interactions with others. Teachers are mentors and guides. The environment, in this approach, is also a teacher. Finally, parents and the community also play a vital role in this approach. Parents and parenting adults in the lives of the children are required to participate, as we wish to help foster posi-

tive interactions between parents/parenting-adults and children. The Reggio Emilia class groups are currently offered only in Spanish. The free play time is offered mainly in Spanish, but it is open to everyone and language is not a barrier for participation. This program is currently funded by a grant from the Early Childhood Equity Fund of Oregon's Early Learning Division. For more information, or to volunteer,
